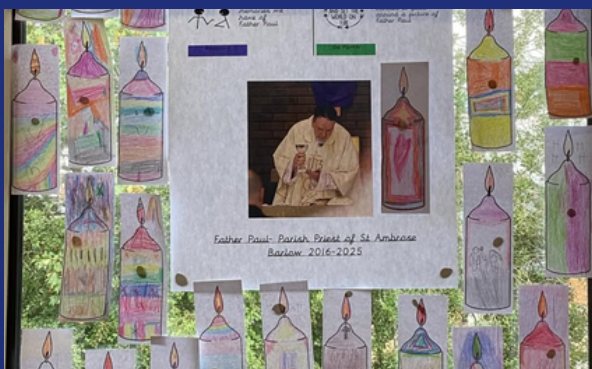
## Honouring Father Paul: A Lasting Tribute

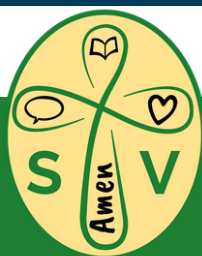
